## **Day One**

*Jesus came to appreciate how intimately God was involved in his life by reflecting upon and praying over his history. With Jesus, you can prayerfully reflect upon your own personal history.*

### **Reminders**

When you journey into God's presence, God regards you with constant love and caring. God is with you each moment of your life. It is helpful to take time before going to bed to look over your day and to notice where you have felt God's presence and where you have been unaware of God's presence.

### **Scripture Passages – Suggested Texts for Prayer**

- Jeremiah 1:1-10 God's call of Jeremiah
- Hosea 11:1-4 God's outpouring of love
- Mark 1:9-11 Jesus is baptized in the Jordan River and experiences God's call in a special way

### **Reflection Experience**

Jesus came to know the presence of God in his life through his mother's teaching, through Scripture, through his life experiences and prayerful reflection on these experiences. For Jesus, as for you, 'memory' was the sacrament of God's presence.

As Jesus himself must have done, you too can pray over the stuff of your own experience, your personal history:

- ⌘ the events,
- ⌘ the experiences,
- ⌘ the people who have crossed your path,
- ⌘ the jobs you have held,
- ⌘ the gifts you have been given,
- ⌘ your accomplishments,
- ⌘ your failures.

With Jesus as your guide, take some time to go down 'memory lane' and contemplate the events of your own personal history, seeking how God, Jesus and the Spirit have been involved in your life.

### **Prayer of the Day**

Loving God, You offer me so much.  
You give me so many days and years,  
So many strengths and abilities,  
So many rich things and splendid machines,  
And you surround me with so many whom I may love.  
Teach me this one thing above all\_  
How I am to choose.  
Then I hope to return to You  
As many wonders as You have poured out on me.  
Through Christ Jesus  
My friend and brother. Amen.

## **Day Two**

*God desires to be in an intimate relationship with you. God invites you to experience an abundance of love.*

### **Reminders**

- Find and fix a time when you can pray and not be disturbed.
- Find and fix a place as your prayer place.
- You will need only a Bible, a notebook and the materials distributed by your prayer director.

### **Scripture Passages**

- Psalm 139:1-18 God surrounds you with love and acceptance
- Isaiah 43:1-7 You are precious in my eyes and I love you
- Ephesians 1:3-14 God's overall plan

### **Reflection Questions:**

## **Reflection Experience**

## **Day Three**

*To know Jesus intimately is to know that you are forgiven and constantly need God's forgiveness. Jesus is constantly desiring to save you from the effects of sin which render you helpless. When you allow Jesus to do so, he is in personal relationship with you.*

*You are called beyond yourself, into deeper union with Jesus with your weaknesses and fears in spiritual freedom. You are called to know and experience Jesus in the power flowing from the resurrection.*

## **Reminders**

You want God to reveal to you the mystery deep within you. Ask God to give you the gift of healing and freedom.

Ask God to help you come to know and love Jesus in a more complete and intimate way.

Jot down any words or images that may come from your prayer.

## **Scripture passages – Suggested texts for prayer**

- Luke 7:36-50 The sinful woman washes the feet of Jesus
- Luke 15:11-32 The return of the lost child
- John 13:1-7 Jesus washes the disciples' feet

## **Reflection Questions:**

- Where do you need to experience the healing power of Jesus?
  
- Where do you need to experience the forgiving power of Jesus?
  
- Where have you experienced these gifts before?

## **Reflection Experience**

Take some time in prayer to review the experience of this past week. Then spend some time, also in prayer, reflecting on the following points.

- What has been the grace, the gift, for you during this time of prayer?
- What were the most significant moments for you during this past week?
- Can you name in a word or an image the moment that you felt most connected with God? With Jesus? With the presence of the Spirit?
- What have you heard God speak to you?
- To what do you hear God calling you as a result of these times of prayer?
